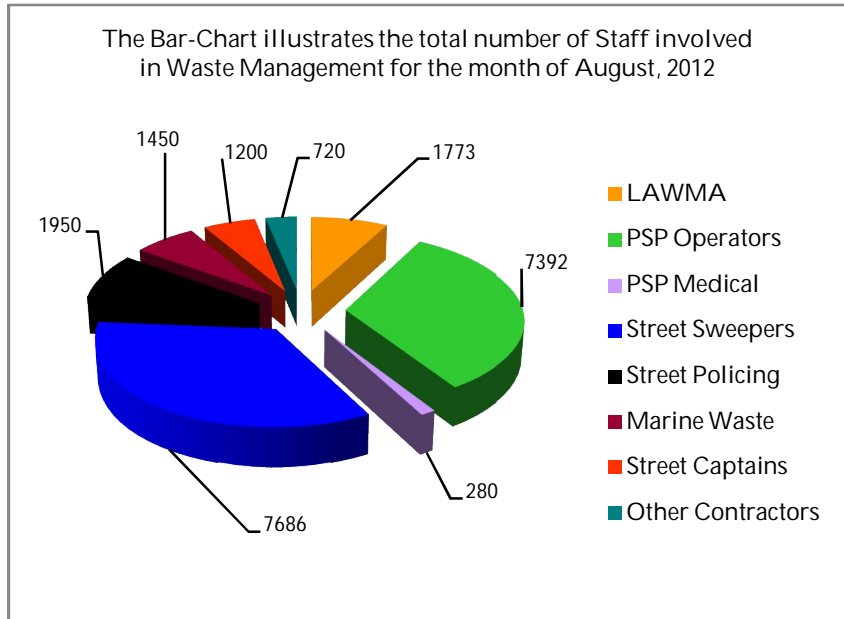


WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE
MONTH OF AUGUST 2012

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of August 2012. The core area of focus during the month under review include domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous), market waste. Street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and TLS management.

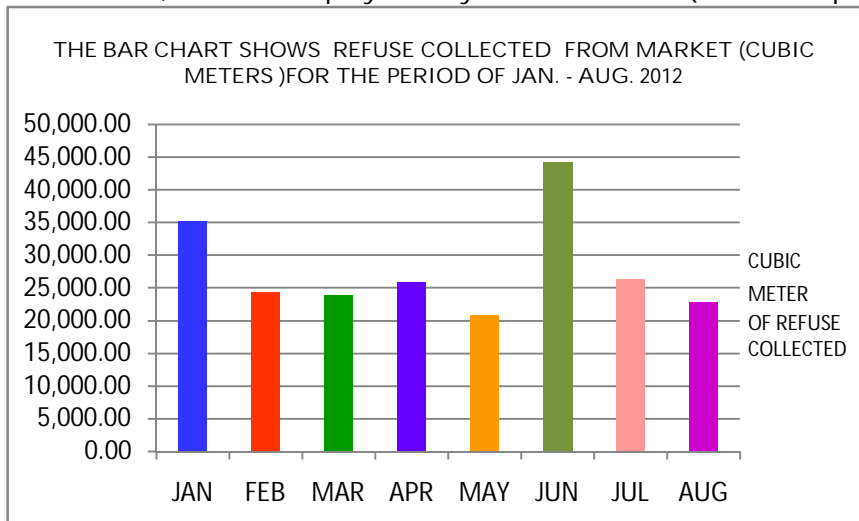
2. The attached report for the month of August, 2012 indicates the following:



GENERAL ADMINISTRATION:

Over 22,000 workforce were deployed in the service of Waste Management in the State during the month. The breakdown includes:

- 1,773 direct employment by LAWMA
- 7,392 direct employment by the PSP operators
- 280 direct employment by PSP/Medical Waste operators
- 7,686 direct employment by Service Providers(Street Sweeping)

- 1,950 direct employment by the street Policing companies
- 1,450 direct employment by the Marine Waste Service Providers
- 1,200 support services by the Street Captains
- 720 direct employment by other Contractors and Service Support Companies

LANDFILL

- A total of 335,356.44m³ ⁽¹⁾ of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (June 2012: 314,824m³ & July 2012:

- A total of 24,384 Vehicular trips were received at landfill sites: Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe, Simpson and Oshodi TLS

MEDICAL WASTE

- A total of 8,134 safety boxes, 43,684kg of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State.
- A total of 2,363 commercial medical/healthcare facilities were serviced while 62 new facilities were enlisted. (June 2012: 2,270 & July 2012: 2,270)

- Public Enlightenment and awareness programmes were carried out on eleven(11) radio stations these includes:

PSP PROGRAMME

- A total of 333 PSP Operators serviced 368 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
 - 120 complaints relating to service delivery and 150 online bill reconciliation were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
 - 2 PSP meetings were held in the month (4th & 15th August, 2012)
 - 4 CDA/CDC meetings were held during the period in the following areas: Ayobo-Ipaja CDA, Moson Oyenola CDC, Agbado Oke-Odo CDA, Ojo-Iba CDA, Mushin-Odiolowo CDA, Amalgamated CDA's from Oduelu Ward and Itire Community Development Association
 - 9,500 pieces of trash bags were distributed free to tenements in Makoko, Badiya Bariga, and Ajegunle during the period
 - Intervention services were provided by LAWMA trucks in the following areas due to poor performance of the PSP operators:
 - ❖ Glover Freeman-Ebute Metta, Baruwa Ward-Itire Ikate, Ikola-Agbado Oke Odo, botanical Garden-Ebute Metta, Alakara Ward-Odi Olowo/Ojuwoye, Odeselu Ward-Mushin Ajina, Araromi-Lagos Mainland, Odofin-Amuwo-Odofin, Command Ajasa Road, Ijegin Ward-Oriade, Ajegunle-Ajeromi, Ilasamaja-Isolo

STREET SWEEPING

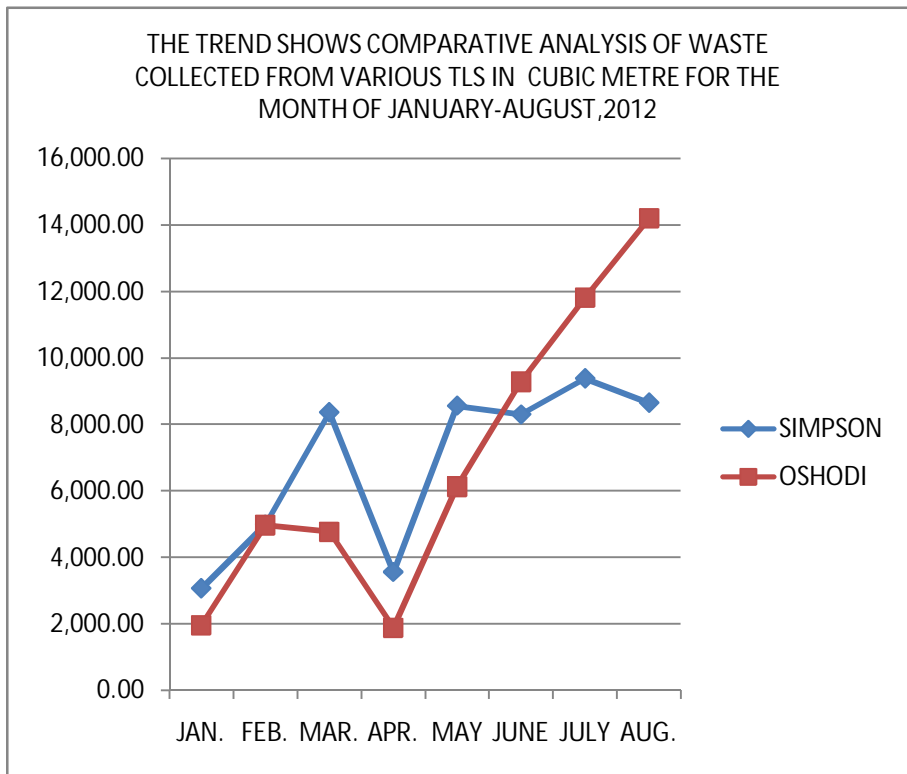
- 158 Service Providers with 7,670 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,502 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
 - deployment of 14nos. trucks to all regions daily to ensure prompt evacuation of silts and tyres on the highway
 - evacuation of bagged silt and black bags on road medians and verges
 - deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations at Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi & Airport Road & 3rd Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways
 - Continuous education on health and safety for sweepers at regional levels
 - Placement of road camps in strategic routes across the region. A total of 18nos. road camp are presently located on major highways in the State

MARKET WASTE

- A total of 22,708.94m³ waste was collected from markets during the month (June 2012: 44,179m³ & July 2012: 26,365.9m³)

STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

- Street policing outfits carried out operations on 29 major highways. Some of the areas policed include: Ojota, Oregun, Aginjingbi, Ikorodu Road, Ketu-Mile 12-Owode Onirin inward Ikorodu, Yaba-Oyingbo, Apapa-Oshodi Expressway, Ilesa- Balex, Isolo Lasu-Iba-Igando, Abaronje, Ikotun, Ikotun roundabout, Egbeda, Orile Iganmu-Mile 2, Maryland-Mobolaji-Bank Anthony inward Ikeja, Agege motorway, Pen Cinema inward Iju-Ishaga, Ojodu, Ikeja, Oriade, Lagos Island inward Amadu Bello inward Lekki axis etc

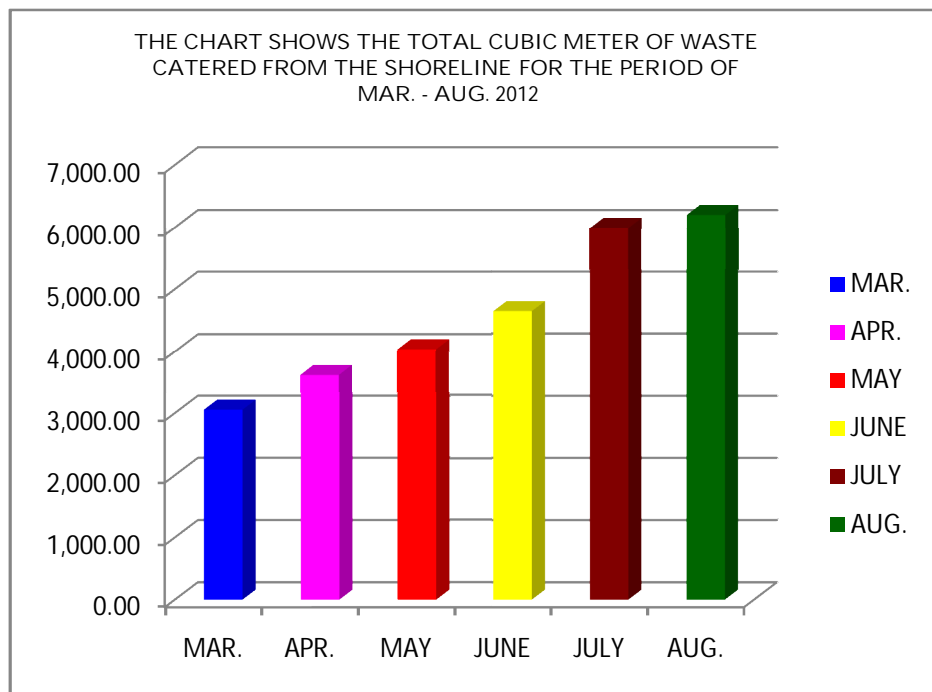


TRANSFER LOADING STATION

- Simpson TLS received a total of 8,654.89m³ ⁽²⁾ of waste during the month. (June 2012: 8,303.06m³ & July 2012: 9,385.16m³)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of 14,191.27m³ of waste during the month. (June 2012: 9,276.42m³ & July 2012: 11,800.42m³)

RECYCLING

- A total of 119rolls of Nylon of about 385kg was produced at the Olushosun Plastic Recycling plant from the collected pure water sachet from buy-back centres
- A total of 1,900 tonnes of compost were produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost Plant while a total of 38,000bags of compost of (25kg) were bagged
- Other recyclable materials collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 163kg, Can 114kg, Pet bottle 570.5kg and Paper 163kg



MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,189 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Oworonshoki, Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Badagry, Ketu Alapere Canal, Lekki, Adeniji Adele along Ita Oba, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Iddo, Oyingbo Canal, Orile Canal, Walter Carrington, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Obalende Canal, Masha-Akerele Canal, Iwaya Canal etc
- A total of 6,203.74m³ (June 2012: 4,644.49m³ & July 2012: 5,995.84m³) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review

3. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT

- The Federal Government of Nigeria conferred an award of

- *Waste -To-Food project* was launched during the month as part of school advocacy program in recycling during the long vacation. This was carried out in conjunction with major partners such as Tasty Fried Chicken, Children and the Environment (CATE), Lagos Empowerment and Resource Network (LERN) and various NGO's such as Alkem Nigeria, Church of The Latter Day Saints etc
- The Honourable Commissioner for the Environment, handed over *19 new skip trucks* to female drivers in continuation of the improve service delivery strategy for public waste collection in narrow streets and slum areas

Launching of the Waste-To-Food Program

- 35 Higher Institution Students were offered vacation jobs for 3 months(July-September) to complement the *State Government Student Empowerment program*

- 15 students of junior workers were offered scholarship to support the education careers of brilliant higher institution students of staff of LAWMA

- Interactive session for effective collaboration and integration of service delivery with Local governments and LGAs' was carried out at Kosofe, Agboyi-Ketu and Ikosi Isheri LGAs' during the month

4. OBSERVATIONS AND CHALLENGES

- The dry weather for the month of August permitted upgrade of access roads on all the landfill sites. These has a direct consequence on the improved turn around time of the waste collection trucks during the month
- Alarming increase in the cost of diesel and spare parts is affecting the operational maintenance cost of operation for LAWMA and PSP operators
- Collaboration with Ogun State Government (OGEPA) along the contiguous settlement between the two States is impacting positively on public hygiene along this corridor of common interest
- Poor road network and accessibility in low income areas in Ajegunle (Tolu area), Amukoko (Kasidi), Badiya and Ajangbadi is making waste collection very difficult for service providers in these areas that are presently witnessing near breakdown in public health service delivery
- CDAs' and LGAs' are finding it hard to organise and co-ordinate residents within poor communities and slum areas of the State for effective intervention by LAWMA and PSP operators
