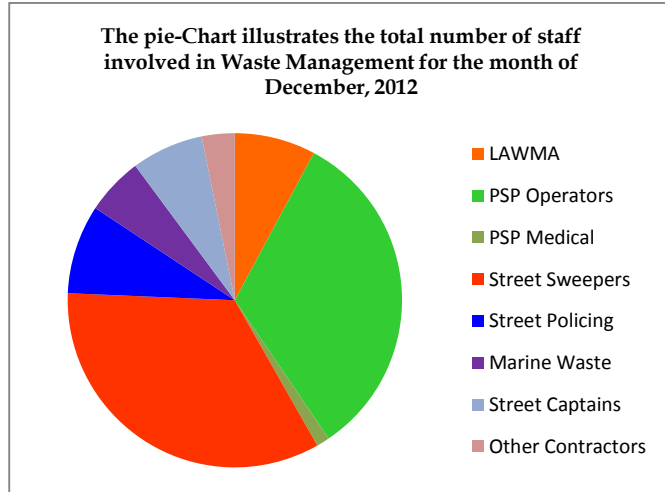




## WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER 2012

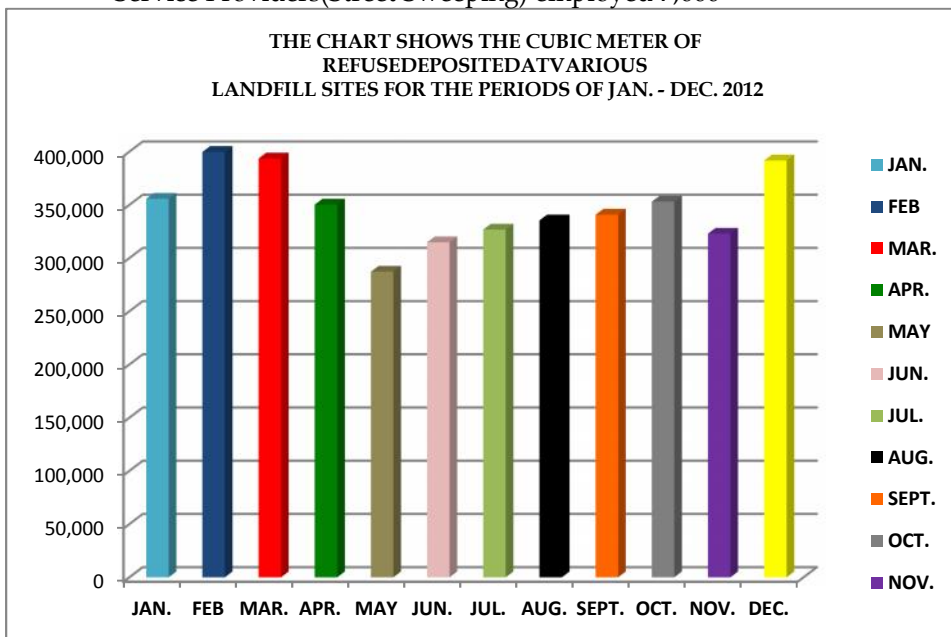
The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of December, 2012. Our focus during the period under review include: domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous) and market waste. Others are street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and Transfer Loading Station management.



2. Summary of report for the month of December, 2012 indicates the following:

**GENERAL ADMINISTRATION:** A total of 22,373 workforce were deployed during the month for waste management operations. The breakdown includes:

- LAWMA employed 1,676
- PSP operators employed 7,391
- PSP/Medical Waste operators employed 280
- Service Providers(Street Sweeping) employed 7,660



- Street Policing companies employed 1,950
- Marine Waste Service employed 1,259 direct labour
- Street Captains employed 1,575 support services
- Contractors and other support Service Companies employed 740 direct labour

### LANDFILL

• A total of 391,704.73m<sup>3</sup> <sup>(1)</sup> of waste was collected during the

month (Landfill report attached). (Oct 2012: 353,032.43m<sup>3</sup> & Nov 2012: 322,949.11m<sup>3</sup>)

- A total of 19,835 *Vehicular trips* were received at landfill sites: *Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe, Simpson and Oshodi TLS*

**MEDICAL WASTE**

- A total of 4,992.52 *safety boxes*, 28,403.60kg of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State. (Including the General Hospitals and Primary Healthcare Centres).
- A total of 2,107 *commercial medical/healthcare facilities* were serviced while 14 new facilities were enlisted. (Oct 2012: 2,115 & Nov 2012: 2,018)

- Public Enlightenment and awareness programmes were carried out on eleven(11) radio stations these includes:

**PSP PROGRAMME**

- A total of 336 *PSP Operators* serviced 368 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
  - 309 *complaints* relating to service delivery and *online bill reconciliation* were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
  - 10,000 trash bags were distributed free across the State
  - 1 *PSP meeting* was held in the month (19<sup>th</sup> December, 2012)
  - 1 *PSP Operator* was suspended for *ineffective service delivery*
  - 2 *CDA/CDC meetings* were held during the period in the following areas:
    - ✓ 6<sup>th</sup> December, 2012: Amuwo Odofin
    - ✓ 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2012: Tedi/Mowo Community Barracks, Ojo
  - Intervention services were provided by LAWMA trucks in the following areas due to poor performance of the PSP operators:

**STREET SWEEPING**

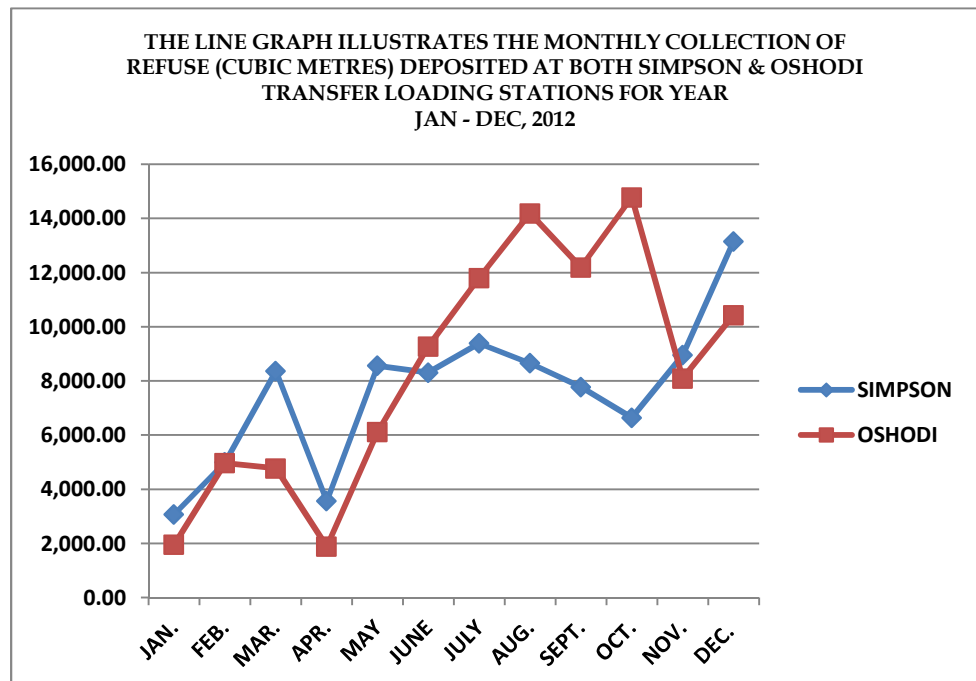
- 158 Service Providers with 7,660 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,520 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
  - Deploying sweepers to all the designated event centres for the closing ceremony of the National Sports Festival
  - Special clean-up on Ahmadu Bello Way during the Lagos count down
  - Deployment of sweepers to Eko Atlantic City for the Lagos Count down
  - Special sweeping operations was carried out during the Christmas and New Year celebrations
  - Continuous deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations on Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi, Airport Road, 3<sup>rd</sup> Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways

**MARKET WASTE**

- A total of 25,803.23m<sup>3</sup> waste was collected from day and night markets during the month (Oct. 2012: 21,671m<sup>3</sup> & Nov. 2012: 21,467.81m<sup>3</sup>)

**STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT**

- Street policing outfits carried out operations on 58 major highways. Some of the areas policed include: Oke Afa, Okota, Cele(Express Road), Sadiku, Ilasa, Barlet, Isolo Road, Iyana-Itire, Ikotun, Okoko, Iyana-Ishasi-Ijanikin, Agbara, Maza-maza, Trade Fair, Ojo Barracks, Amuwo-Odofin,





Ijora 7-up, Ijora Oloye, Iganmu, Ojodu Berger, Alausa, Ikeja Central Business District, Ile Zik, Abesan, Ipaja/Baruwa, Gowon Estate, Abaranje, Ikorodu Road, Oworonshoki Axis, Alapere, Ketu Mile 12, Owode Onirin, Ikorodu e.t.c

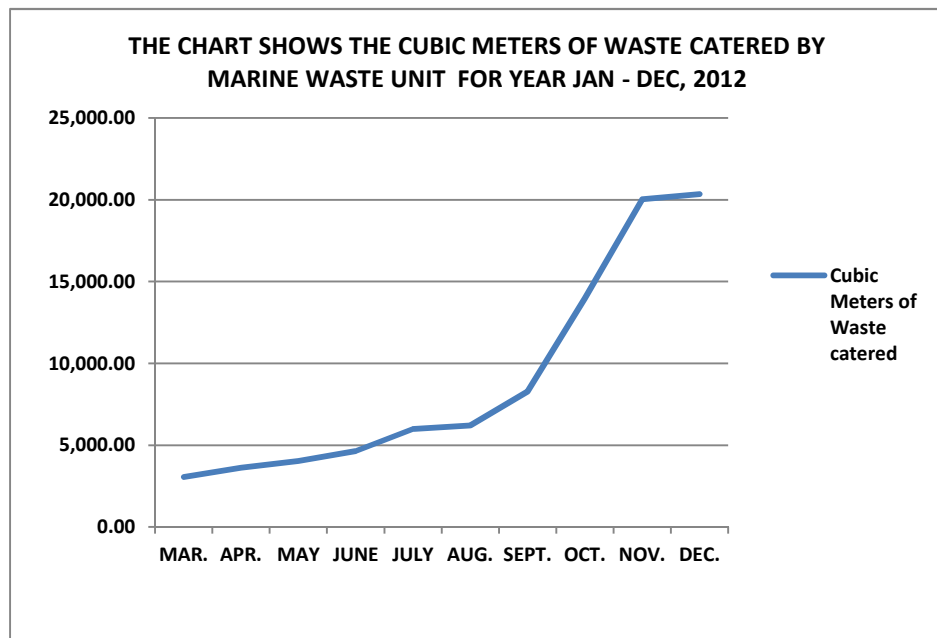
- A total of 49 sanitation offenders were apprehended and successfully prosecuted. 12 premises were sealed up and prosecuted for sanitation offences in Lekki Aja Axis, Agege, Iyana-Ipaja, Ebute-Meta and Yaba.

### TRANSFER LOADING STATION

- Simpson TLS received a total of **13,147.84m<sup>3</sup>** of waste during the month. (Oct. 2012: 6,642.40m<sup>3</sup> & Nov. 2012: 8,950.83m<sup>3</sup>)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of **10,431.70m<sup>3</sup>** of waste during the month. (Oct. 2012: 14,781.94m<sup>3</sup> & Nov. 2012: 8,090.44m<sup>3</sup>)

### RECYCLING

- A total of 13rolls of Nylon of about 300kg was produced at the Olushosun Plastic Recycling plant from the collected pure water sachet at the various buy-back centres
- A total of 1,950 tonnes of compost was produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost plant
- Other recyclable materials



collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 1,728kg, Can 486kg, Pet bottle 4,911kg, Nylon 3,348kg and Bottle 718kg

### MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,259 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Obalende Canal, Masha-Akerele Canal, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Ketu-Alapere canal, Mile 2, Makoko, Ipakodo, Badagry, Lekki, Adeniji Adele, Walter Carrington, Orile Canal, Iwaya Canal, Iddo, Oyingbo, Apapa, Oworonshoki, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Ibeshe, Marina etc



# LAWMA

- A total of  $20,345.11m^3$  (Oct 2012:  $13,979.21m^3$  & Nov 2012:  $20,029.1m^3$ ) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review.

### 3. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT

- LAWMA adequately managed waste generation in all the venues used during the 18<sup>th</sup> National Sports Festival “Eko 2012” held between 27<sup>th</sup> November and 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2012
- Sanitization of Eko Atlantic City in preparation for and during the Lagos Cross-Over Festival held between 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2012 and 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2013 was successfully carried out

### 4. OBSERVATIONS AND CHALLENGES

- There was an increase in the volume of waste collected during the month of December compared to October/November as a result of various sporting and social activities particularly during the Christmas period
- LAWMA require additional waste compactor trucks to replace the ageing ones for effective service delivery in the State
- The inaccessible nature of some of the street in Lagos suburb have been a major hindrance to efficient PSP operation in the State
