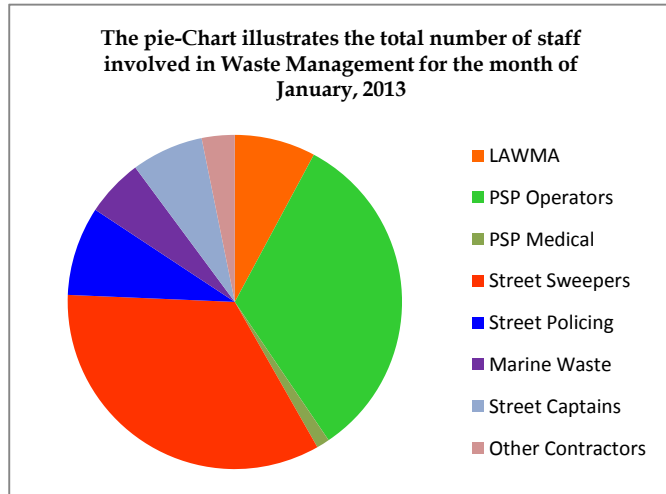




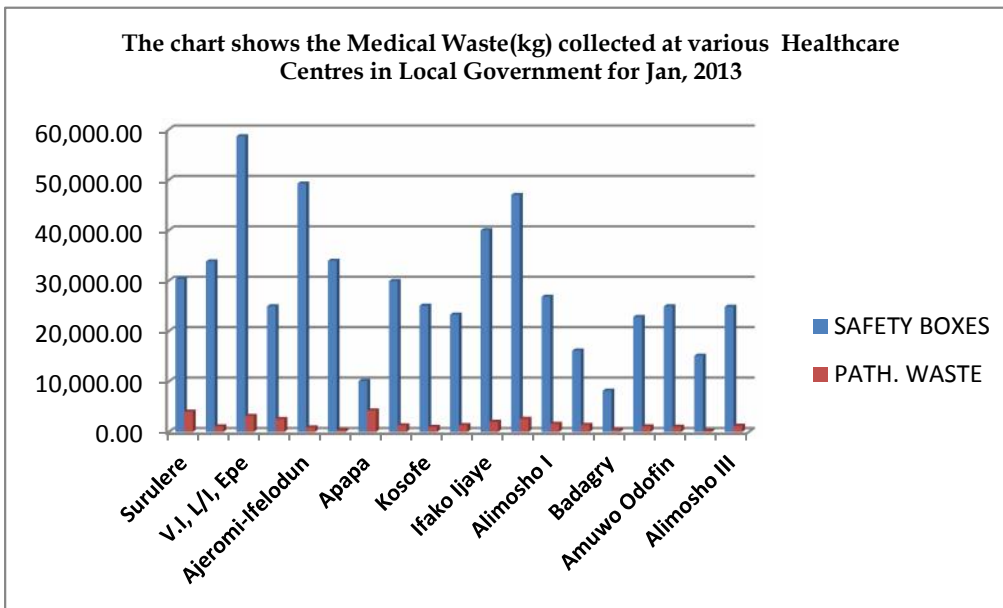
WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY 2013

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of January, 2013. Our focus during the period under review include: domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous) and market waste. Others are street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and Transfer Loading Station management.

2. Summary of report for the month of January, 2012 indicates the following:



GENERAL ADMINISTRATION: A total of 22,373 workforce were deployed during the month for waste management operations same as in the previous month.



LANDFILL

- A total of 342,012.27m³ ⁽¹⁾ of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (Nov 2012: 322,949.11m³ & Dec 2012: 391,704.73m³)

- A total of 17,016 Vehicular trips were received at landfill sites: Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe, Simpson and Oshodi TLS

MEDICAL WASTE

- A total of **8,010kg safety boxes, 46,18kg** of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State. (Including the General Hospitals and Primary Healthcare Centres).
- A total of **2,119 commercial medical/healthcare facilities** were serviced while 30 new facilities were enlisted. (Nov 2012: 2,018 & Dec 2012: 2,017)

PSP PROGRAMME

- A total of **336 PSP Operators** serviced 367 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
 - **197 complaints** relating to service delivery and **online bill reconciliation** were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
 - **235 wheeler Bins** were distributed to household
 - **1 PSP meeting** was held in the month (14th January, 2013)
 - Reorganization of PSP operations in **Ikorodu, Eti Osa, Ibeju Lekki and Ikoyi** areas of the State
 - **1 PSP Operator** was suspended for ineffective service delivery
 - **3 CDA/CDC meetings** were held during the period in the following areas:
 - ✓ 3rd January, 2013: **Post Office Road, Odi Olowo CDA**
 - ✓ 4th January, 2013: **Tedi/Mowo**
 - ✓ 10th January, 2013: **Igando CDA**

STREET SWEEPING

- 158 Service Providers with 7,660 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,520 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
 - Special Cleanup during and after the State Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 6th January, 2013
 - Integration of the MOE Sanitation and Vegetal Control Gang into LAWMA's Street Sweeping Services
 - Continuous deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations on Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi, Airport Road, 3rd Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways

MARKET WASTE

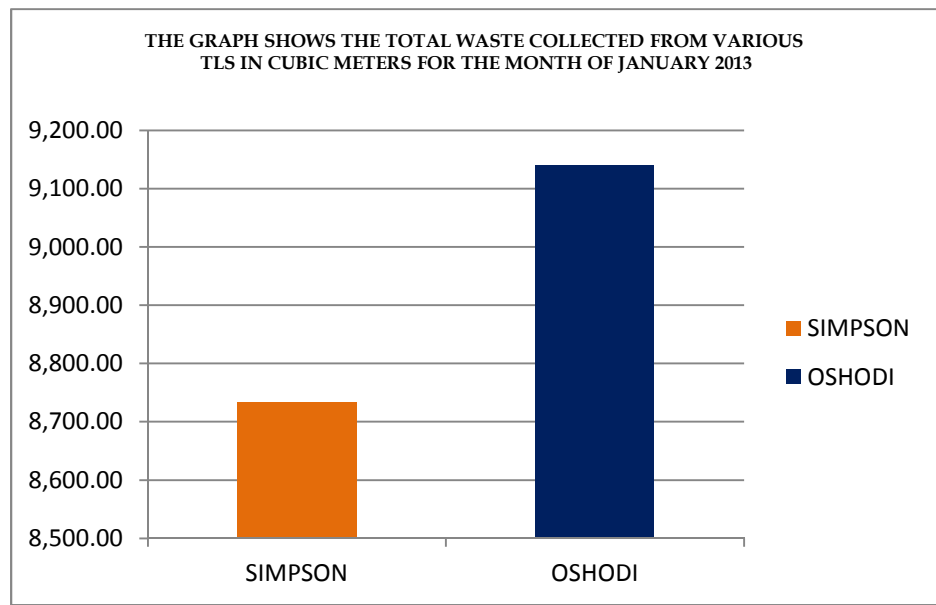
- A total of 23,320.16m³ waste was collected from day and night markets during the month (Nov. 2012: 21,467.81m³ & Dec. 2012: 25,803.23m³)

STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

- Street policing outfits carried out operations on 56 major highways. Some of the areas policed include: seme Border- Badagry Roundabout-Ajara, CMS/Inner Marina/Outer marina, Ajegunle-Majidun-Ipakodo, Oshohi Oke-Toyota-Airport Road, Ikorodu Road(both sides) Oworonshoki Axis-Alapere- Toll Gate, Mile 12-Ajegunle-Epo, Ojota through Oregun to Alausa, Moshalashi-Post office, Isolo Road, Sadiku Express, Ojuelegba, Obele-Lawanson Road, Oke Afa-Ikotun Roundabout, Jakande Estate, Isheri Osun, Ijegun Road, Shangotedo, Lakowe, Ibeju, Ilasan, Ajah, Badore, Ahmadu Bello, Akin Adesola, Idumagbo-Adeniji Adele Loop
- A total of 25 sanitation offenders were apprehended and successfully prosecuted. 10 premises were sealed up and prosecuted for sanitation offences in Ikorodu Road, Agric Ikorodu, Owutu, Ipakodo and Orile (Doyin)
- A total of 542 Carts were sized at various locations in the State and were crushed at Olushosum Landfill Site.

TRANSFER LOADING STATION

- Simpson TLS received a total of 8,732.83m³ of waste during the month. (Nov. 2012: 8,950.83m³ & Dec. 2012: 13,147.84m³)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of 9,139.09m³ of





waste during the month. (Nov. 2012: 8,090.44m³ & Dec. 2012: 10,431.70m³)

RECYCLING

- The machine at the recycling facility in Olushosun Landfill Site underwent a total overhaul in the month under review
- A total of 1,860 tonnes of compost was produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost plant
- Other recyclable materials collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 1,652kg, Can 415.42kg, Pet bottle 3,793.7kg, Bottle 1,124kg and Paper 61kg

MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,259 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Obalende Canal, Masha-Akerele Canal, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Ketu-Alapere canal, Mile 2, Makoko, Ipakodo, Badagry, Lekki, Adeniji Adele, Walter Carrington, Orile Canal, Iwaya Canal, Iddo, Oyingbo, Apapa,

- Oworonshoki, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Ibeshe, Marina etc

• A total of 21,690.23m³ (Nov 2012: 20,029.1m³ & Dec 2012: 20,345.11m³) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review.

- Provision of first aid boxes at all marine waste locations

3. **NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT**

- The Authority has commenced screening of the shoreline with wire mesh to prevent refuse washing from swampy hide tide areas reclaimed with refuse such as Makoko, Iwaya Canal and Masha-Akerele Canal
- Integration of MOE Vegetal Control Gang Unit with the Highway Sanitation for a better co-ordinated workforce and proper cleansing of highways within the Lagos Metropolis
- Significant work done in capping of Olushosun Landfill Site with Laterite to prevent emission of gaseous odour and fire outbreak in anticipation of the raining season
