

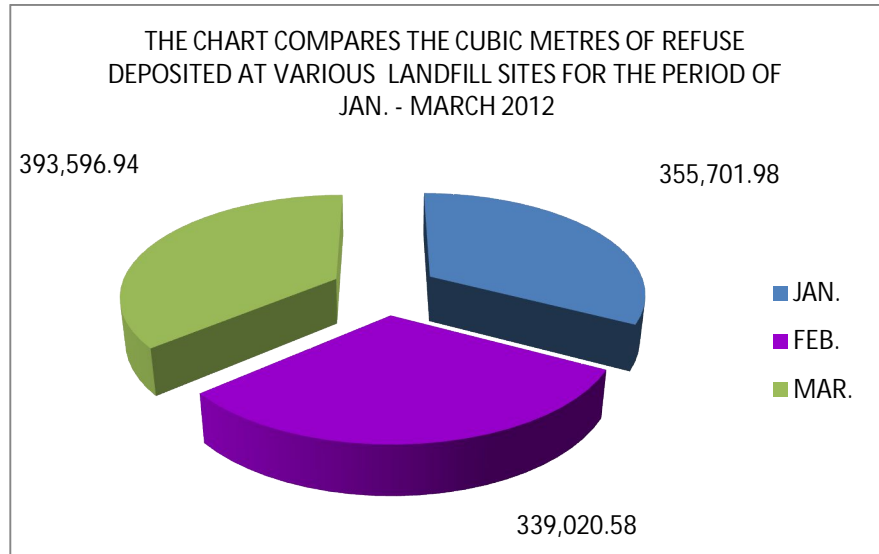
WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE
MONTH OF MARCH 2012

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) as usual co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of March 2012. The core areas of focus during the month under review include domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous), market waste. Street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and TLS management.

2. The attached report for the month of March, 2012 indicates the following:

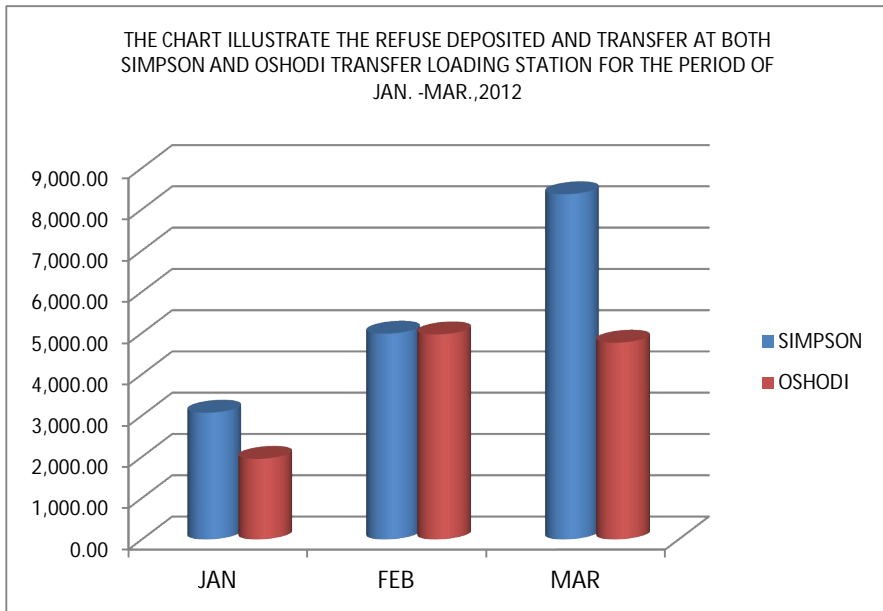
LANDFILL

- A total of 393,600.55m³ ⁽¹⁾ of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (Jan 2012: 355,701.98m³ & Feb 2012: 339,020.58 m³)
- A total of 18,552 Vehicular trips were received at landfill sites: Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe and Simpson TLS.



MEDICAL WASTE

- A total of 6,900 safety boxes, 31,215kg of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State.



- A total of 1,703 commercial medical/healthcare facilities were serviced while 6 new facilities were enlisted. (Jan 2012: 1,886 & Feb 2012: 1,635)

PUBLIC RELATIONS

- Public Enlightenment and awareness programmes were carried out on ten(10) radio stations and two television stations

PSP PROGRAMME

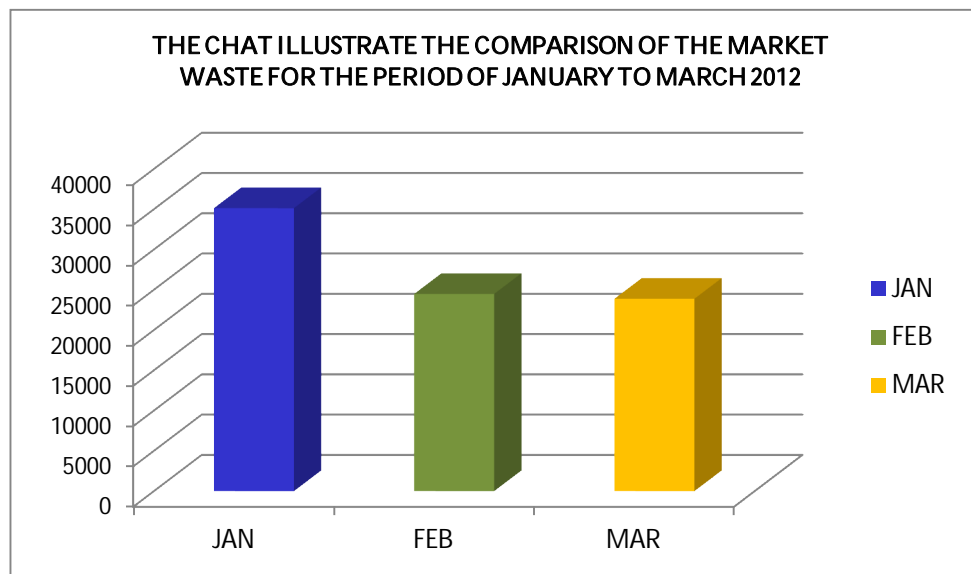
- A total of 326 PSP Operators serviced 368 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
 - 106 complaints relating to service delivery and 217 online bill reconciliation were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
 - 2 PSP meetings were held in the month
 - 13 CDA/CDC meetings were held during the period
 - 105 nos wheeler bins were distributed to tenements in the State during the period
 - 15,000 pieces of trash bags were distributed to tenements during the period

STREET SWEEPING

- 157 Service Providers with 7,656 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,504 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
 - Continuous deployment of 12nos. trucks to all regions daily to ensure prompt evacuation of silts and tyres
 - Continuous evacuation of bagged silt and black bags on road medians and verges
 - Continuous deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations at Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi & Airport Road & 3rd Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways
 - Continuous provision of incentives for street sweepers to boost commitment & productivity
 - Effect the 20% increase in sweepers salary as promised by His Excellency at the town hall meeting of 19th February, 2012
 - Organised health and safety talks for sweepers at regional levels

MARKET WASTE

- A total of 23,891.89m³ of waste was collected from markets during the month (Jan 2012: 34,189.19m³ & Feb 2012: 24,494.80 m³)



STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

- A total number of 560 monitoring/street policing outfits carried out operations on 29 major highways. The areas policed include: Agbado Oke Oko, Ifako Ijaiye, Apapa, Orile Iganmu, Egbda, Iju-Ishaga, Oshodi Isolo, Ojodu, Ikeja, Oriade, Ikosi Ketu, Agege, Lagos Island, Lagos Mainland, Agboyi and Kosofe

TRANSFER LOADING STATION

- Simpson TLS received a total of 8,367.57 m³ ⁽²⁾ of waste during the month. (Jan 2012: 6,389.35m³ & Feb 2012: 4,988.86 m³)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of 4,770.89m³ of waste during the month. (Jan 2012: 4,064.45m³ & Feb 2012: 4,970.48 m³)

RECYCLING

- No compost production at Odogunyan Compost Plant (equipment overhauling & turn around maintenance) (Dec 2011: 24,000 & Jan 2012: 18,000 bags of compost)

MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste activities with a work force of 382 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Oworonshoki, Adeniji Adele along Ita Oba, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Iddo, Ajegunle Ikorodu, Kuramo beach, Walter Carrington, Owode Elede etc
 - A total of 5,250m³ of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review
3. Other notable activities of LAWMA during the month include:
- A meeting was held on 6th March, 2012 with His Excellency and the PSP operators for effective operations in the State
 - A test run of waste to electricity ³pilot project was carried out at Ikosi market on 30th March, 2012
 - 186 concrete ⁴waste receptacles were demolished on Victoria Island and Ikoyi. The exercise is on-going
 - Over 314 push carts were confiscated and destroyed
4. Major observations and challenges encountered during the month reveal that:
- Silts evacuated from drainage channels were left uncollected on roads such as Ketu, Mile 12 road, Iwaya, Aguda road, Orile, Babs Animasahun etc
 - Continuous breakdown of old dilapidated trucks of PSP causing accidents
 - Increasing numbers of okada drivers driving one way and knocking down street sweepers(3 such accident cases)
 - There was noticeable increase in the refuse generation and littering at the bar-beach due to the uncontrolled usage of the recreation area
