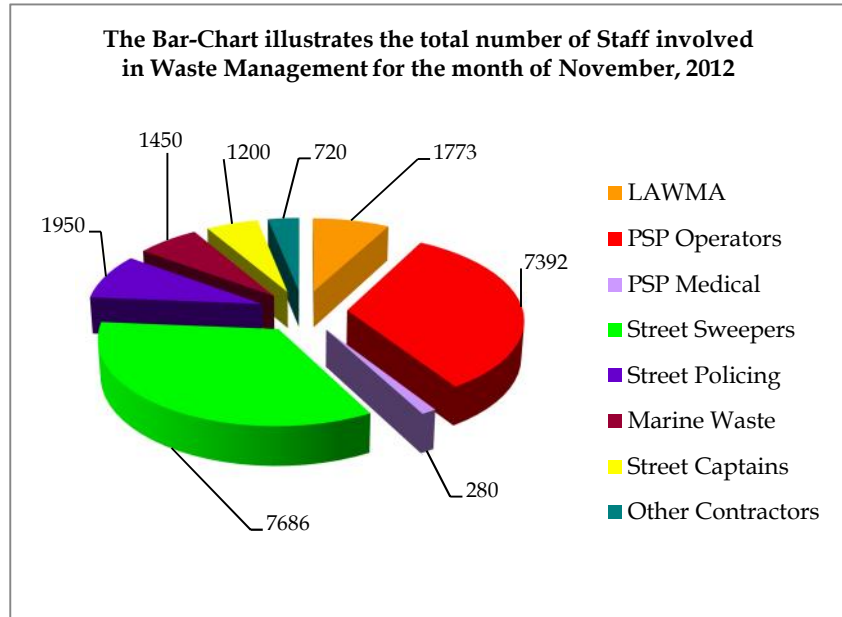




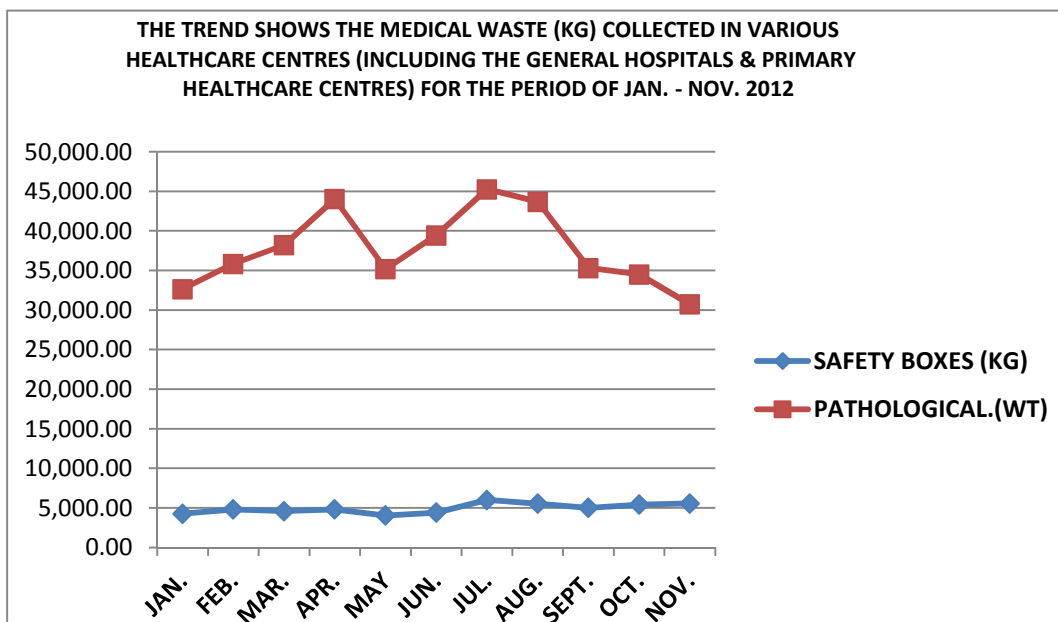
WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER 2012

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of November, 2012. The core area of focus during the period under review include domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous) and market waste. Other areas include: street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and Transfer Loading Station management.

2. Summary of report for the month of November, 2012 indicates the following:



GENERAL ADMINISTRATION: A total of 21,745 workforce were deployed in the service of Waste Management in the State as of the previous month.



LANDFILL

- A total of 322,949.11m³ (1) of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (Sept 2012: 340,769.95m³ & Oct 2012: 353,032.43m³)
- A total of 14,592 Vehicular trips were received at landfill sites: Olushosun,

MEDICAL WASTE

- A total of **5,564.44 safety boxes, 30,731.92kg** of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State. (Including the General Hospitals and Primary Healthcare Centres).
- A total of **2,018 commercial medical/healthcare facilities** were serviced while 5 new facilities were enlisted. (*Sept 2012: 1,681 & Oct 2012: 2,115*)

PSP PROGRAMME

- A total of **337 PSP Operators** serviced 368 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
 - **120 complaints** relating to service delivery and **136 online bill reconciliation** were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
 - **15,000** trash bags were distributed free across the State
 - **1 PSP meeting** was held in the month (14th November, 2012)
 - *Familiarization visit to Oshodi LGA, Ejigbo LCDA on the 29th November, 2012*
 - 2-day Training for the PSP Executives was held at Simpson Transfer Loading Station
 - **4 CDA/CDC meetings** were held during the period in the following areas:

STREET SWEEPING

- 158 Service Providers with 7,660 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,520 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
 - Deploying sweepers to all the designated event centres for the National Sports Festival
 - Continuous deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations on Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi, Airport Road, 3rd Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways

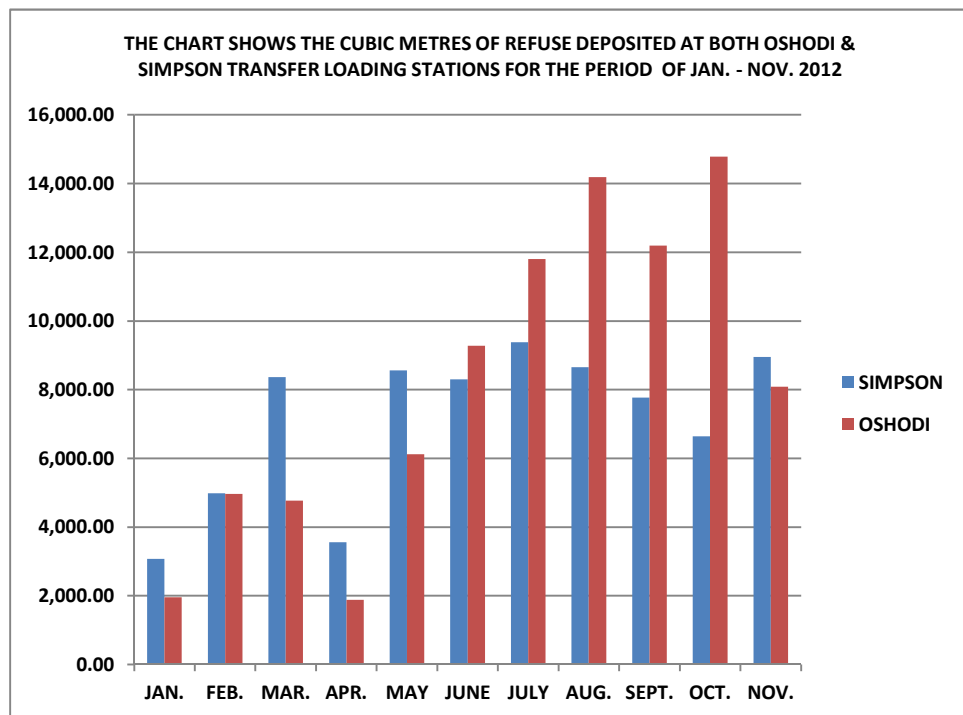
MARKET WASTE

- A total of 21,467.81m³ waste was collected from day and night markets during the month (Sept. 2012: 22,403.33m³ & Oct. 2012: 21,671m³)

STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT

- Street policing outfits carried out operations on 58 major highways. Some of the areas policed include:

Oke Afa, Okota, Cele(Express Road), Sadiku, Ilasa, Barlet, Isolo Road, Iyana-Itire, Ikotun, Okoko, Iyana-Ishasi-Ijanikin, Agbara, Maza-maza, Trade Fair, Ojo Barracks, Amuwo-Odofin, Ijora 7-up, Ijora Oloye, Iganmu, Ojodu Berger, Alausa, Ikeja Central Business District, Ile Zik, Abesan, Ipaja/Baruwa, Gowon Estate, Abaranje, Ikorodu Road,

- A total of 58 sanitation offenders were apprehended and successfully prosecuted. 18 premises were sealed up and prosecuted for sanitation offences in Aja, Sangotedo, Abule-Oja, Ebute-Meta and Agege

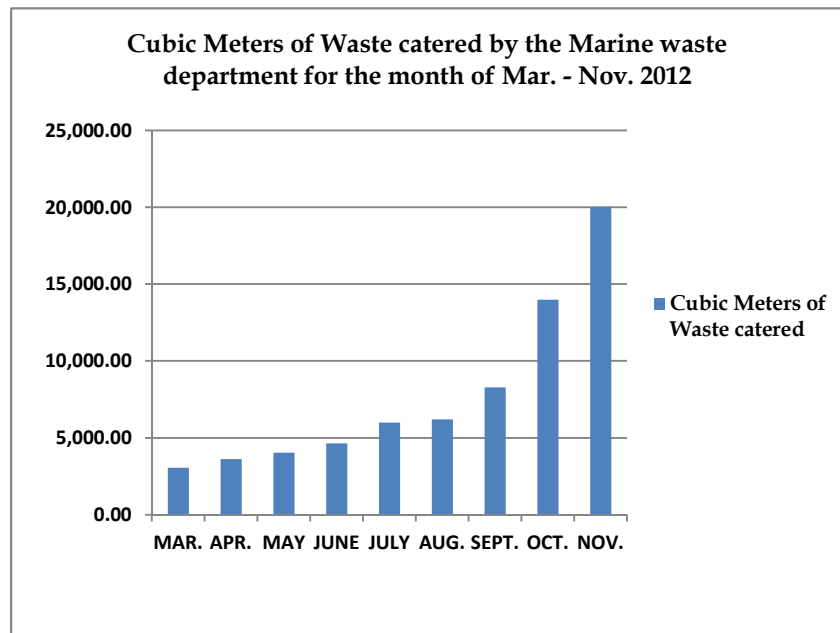


TRANSFER LOADING STATION

- Simpson TLS received a total of 8,950.83m³ of waste during the month. (*Sept. 2012: 7,771.31m³ & Oct. 2012: 6,642.40m³*)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of 8,090.44m³ of waste during the month. (*Sept. 2012: 12,193.35m³ & Oct. 2012: 14,781.94m³*)

RECYCLING

- *A total of 42rolls of Nylon of about 1,375kg was produced at the Olushosun Plastic Recycling plant from the collected pure water sachet at the various buy-back centres*
- *A total of 1,800 tonnes of compost was produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost plant out of which (36,000 bags of 25kg each) were bagged*
- *Other recyclable materials collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 2,816kg, Can 977kg, Pet bottle 4,837.7kg, Nylon 8,278kg and Bottle 1,128kg*



MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,259 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Ibeshe, Epe Marina, Apapa, Ipakodo, Mile 2, Majidun, Makoko, Oworonshoki, Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Badagry, Ketu Alapere Canal, Lekki, Adeniji Adele along Ita Oba, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Iddo, Oyingbo Canal, Orile Canal, Bonny Camp, Walter Carrington, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Obalende Canal, Masha-Akerele Canal, Iwaya Canal etc

- A total of 20,029.1 1m³ (Sept 2012: 8,286.90m³ & Oct 2012: 13,979.21m³) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review. The waste increase in November was as a result of continuous evacuation of water hyacinth on the shore lines and the collection of same

3. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT

- A 2-day training of PSP Executives by *The International Centre for Leadership and Entrepreneurship Development (ICLED)* in partnership with LAWMA was held on the 21st – 22nd November, 2012
- LAWMA was represented at the *United Nations Climate Change Conference 2012 COP 18* held in *Doha* between 21st – 22nd November, 2012

4. OBSERVATIONS AND CHALLENGES

- There was 8% reduction in waste generation in the State compared with the previous month. This may be as a result of cancellation of the November sanitation
- Military formations and Police barracks in the State are not giving the necessary support for the PSP allocated to provide services by refusing to pay for service rendered. This act is prevalent in Gowon Estate Military Barracks, Ojo Cantonment e.t.c
- Poor payment for service rendered by the PSP for domestic premises is a major challenge for the anticipated progress of the PSP program
- There is on-going review of the enforcement clauses in Sanitation/LAWMA Laws for possible effectiveness
- Poor waste management habit in the low income communities is becoming challenging with the attitude of refuse burning during this dry season
