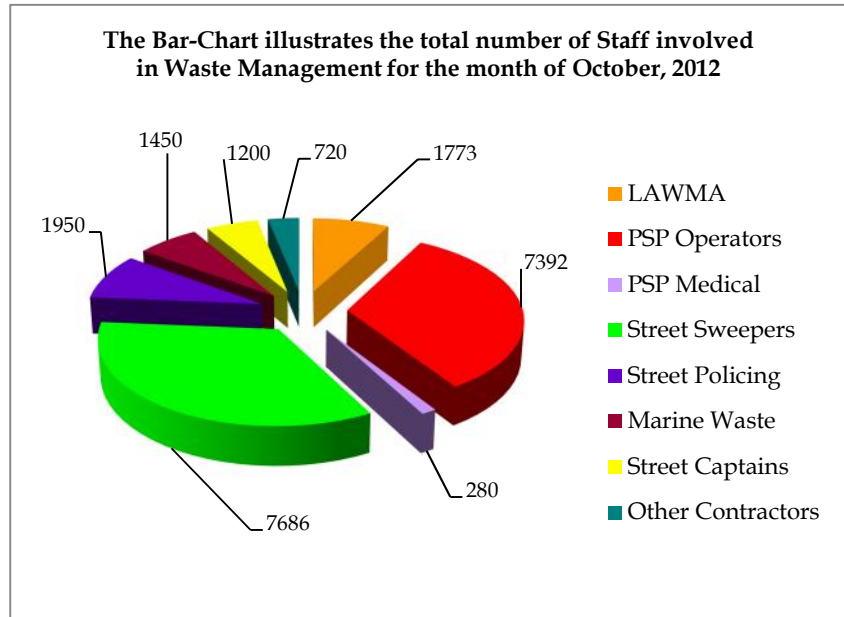




**WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER 2012**

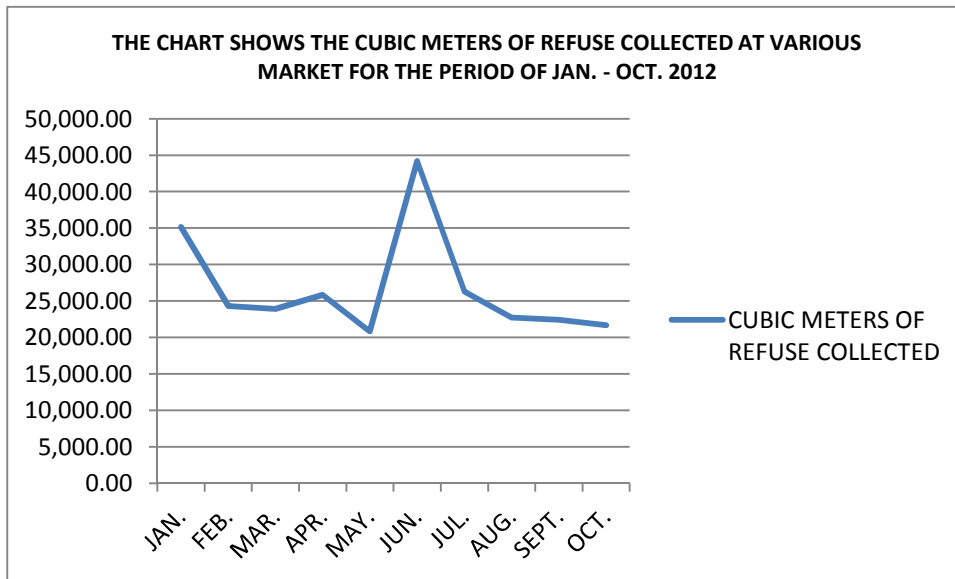
The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of October, 2012. The core area of focus during the period under review include domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous) and market waste. Other areas include: street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and Transfer Loading Station management.

2. Summary of report for the month of October, 2012 indicates the following:



**GENERAL ADMINISTRATION:** A total of 21,745 workforce were deployed in the service of Waste Management in the State during the month. 2 staff were retired while 5 new project staff were employed.

**LANDFILL**



- A total of 353,032.43m<sup>3</sup> <sup>(1)</sup> of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (Aug 2012: 335,356.44m<sup>3</sup> & Sept 2012: 340,769.95m<sup>3</sup>)

- A total of 20,500 Vehicular trips were received at landfill sites: Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe, Simpson and Oshodi TLS

**MEDICAL WASTE**

- A total of 7,953 *safety boxes*, 50,742kg of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State. (Including the General Hospitals and Primary Healthcare Centres).
- A total of 2,115 *commercial medical/healthcare facilities* were serviced while 17 new facilities were enlisted. (Aug 2012: 2,363 & Sept 2012: 2,393)

- Public Enlightenment and awareness programmes were carried out on eleven(11) radio stations these includes:

**PSP PROGRAMME**

- A total of 337 *PSP Operators* serviced 372 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
  - 107 *complaints* relating to service delivery and 113 *online bill reconciliation* were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
  - 1,000,000 trash bags were distributed free across the State during the Ileya festival
  - 1 *PSP meeting* was held in the month (17<sup>th</sup> October, 2012)
  - 2 *CDA/CDC meetings* were held during the period in the following areas:
    - ✓ 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2012: Ikoyi/Obalende
    - ✓ 25<sup>th</sup> October, 2012: Victoria Island
  - *Intervention services were provided by LAWMA trucks in the following areas due to poor performance of the PSP operators:*

**STREET SWEEPING**



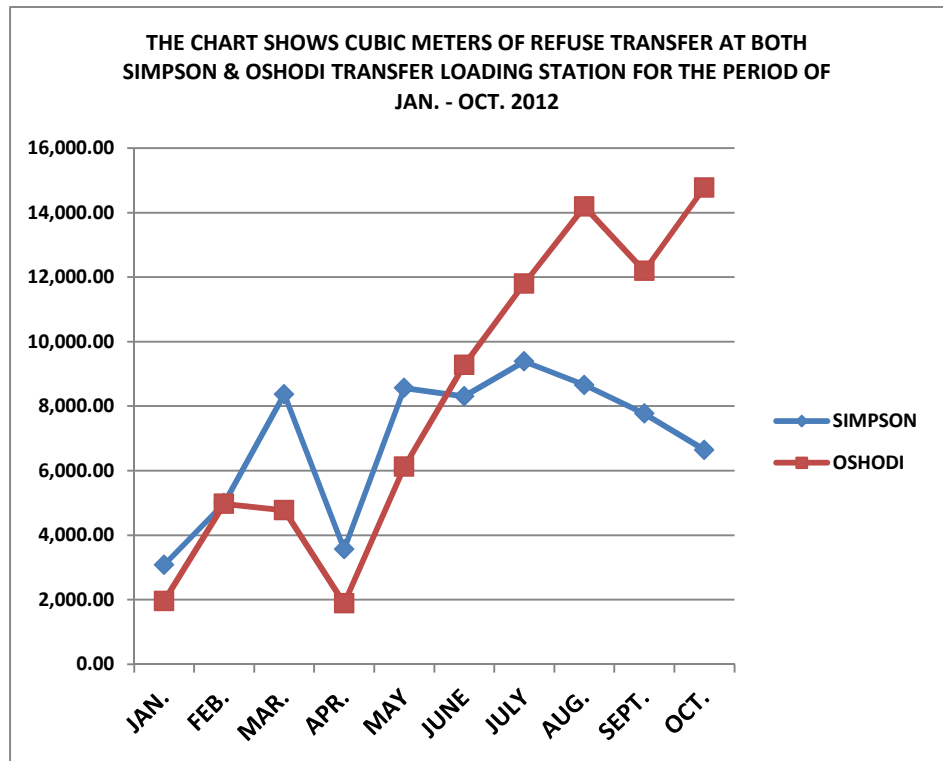
- 158 Service Providers with 7,670 employees (Street Sweepers) and 1,502 Highway Managers were supervised during the month with the following observations:
  - deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations on Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi, Airport Road, 3<sup>rd</sup> Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways

**MARKET WASTE**

- A total of 21,671.0m<sup>3</sup> waste was collected from day and night markets during the month ( Aug. 2012: 22,708.94m<sup>3</sup> & Sept. 2012: 22,403.33m<sup>3</sup>)

**STREET MONITORING AND ENFORCEMENT**

- Street policing outfits carried out operations on 58 major highways. Some of the areas policed include: Pen Cinema, Abule Egba, Abattoir, Iju Ishaga, Ikotun Idimu, Egan, Governor’s Road, Idumagbo, Adeniji Adele loop, Ebute Ero, Apongbon, Tinubu Nnamdi-Azikwe-Abibu-Oki-Martins-Broad Street, Lawanson, Iyana Itire Expressway, Itire-Ijesha Road, Yaba-Murtala Muhammed Way, Oyingbo/Apapa Road, Herbert Macaulay Way, Onike Iwaya, Yaba tech, Jibowu, oshodi Oke, Toyota, Airport Road.



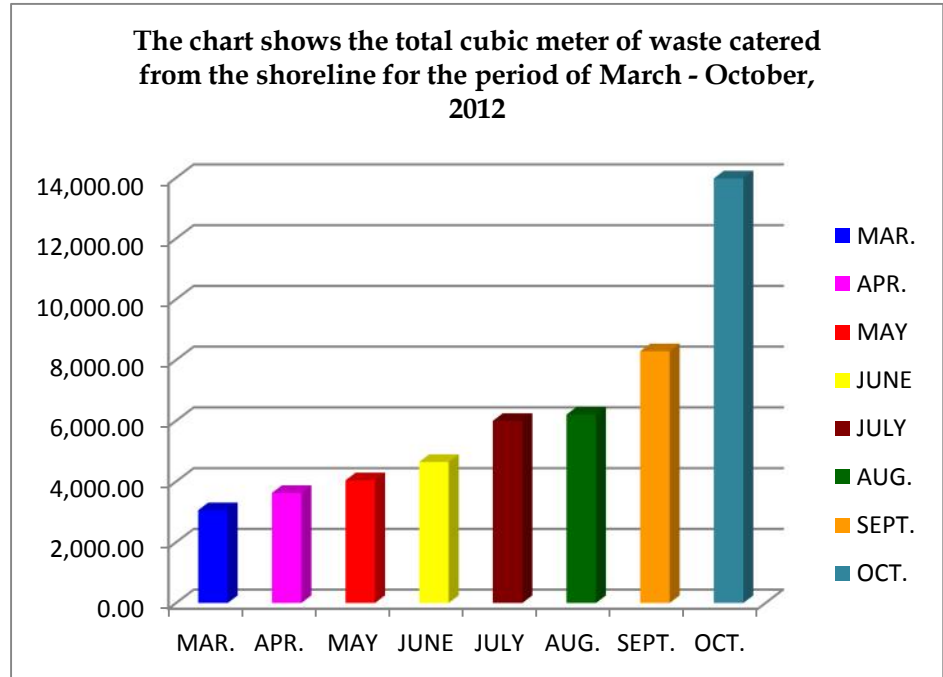
**TRANSFER LOADING STATION**

- Simpson TLS received a total of 6,642.40m<sup>3</sup> of waste during the month. (Aug 2012: 8,654.89m<sup>3</sup> & Sept 2012: 7,771.31m<sup>3</sup>)
- Oshodi TLS received a total of 14,781.94m<sup>3</sup> of waste during the month. (Aug 2012: 14,191.27m<sup>3</sup> & Sept 2012: 12,193.35m<sup>3</sup>)



RECYCLING

- A total of 11rolls of Nylon of about 300kg was produced at the Olushosun Plastic Recycling plant from the collected pure water sachet at the various buy-back centres
- A total of 1,500 tonnes (32,000 bags of 25kg each) of compost was produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost plant
- Other recyclable materials collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 1,365kg, Can 141.6kg, Pet bottle 393kg, Nylon 260.18kg and Paper 48kg



MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,219 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Apapa, Ipakodo, Mile 2, Majidun, Makoko, Oworonshoki, Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Badagry, Ketu Alapere Canal, Lekki, Adeniji Adele along Ita Oba, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Iddo, Oyingbo Canal, Orile Canal, Walter Carrington, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Obalende Canal, Masha-Akerele Canal, Iwaya Canal etc
- A total of 13,979.21m<sup>3</sup> (Aug 2012: 6,203.74m<sup>3</sup> & Sept 2012: 8,286.90m<sup>3</sup>) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review. The waste increase in October was due to emergence of water hyacinth on the shore lines and the collection of same

3. NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT

- The first *National Healthcare Waste Management Summit (NHCWMS 2012)* was held in Abuja in conjunction with Federal Ministry of the Environment and Federal Ministry of Health on the 23<sup>rd</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> October, 2012.

- *Annual Street Sweeping workshop* for Street Sweepers was held on the 11<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> October, 2012
- The Authority successfully completed the *Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) negotiation under the* United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) of *Olushosun, Abule-Egba and*

*Solous landfill sites* in respect of credit grant with *(registration number 6672 Lagos Landfill Gas Nigeria)*

- Recycling programme of LAWMA was given a boost with the commencement of mobile recycling bank in the 6 operational zones of the State

4. **OBSERVATIONS AND CHALLENGES**

- The tonnage of waste deposited in October was greater than the previous month because of the festive activities during the month
- Opening of additional platform at Olushosun Landfill site improved the Turn-Around-Time for waste collection trucks
- The campaign on waste containerization is impacting positively on the people as evident in the use of LAWMA branded waste bags distributed during the sallah festival
- The government investment in radio program is yielding dividend as people are becoming more informed on the need for proper waste disposal making the environment cleaner and safer
