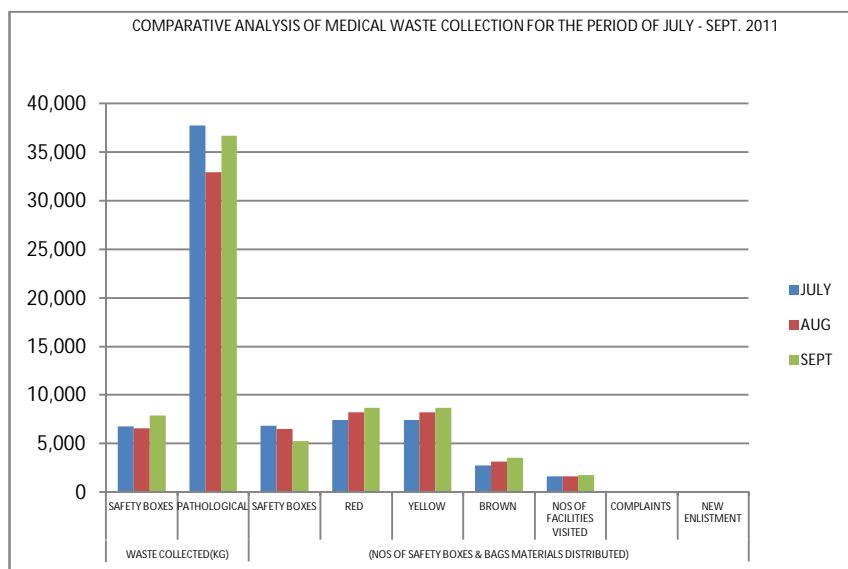
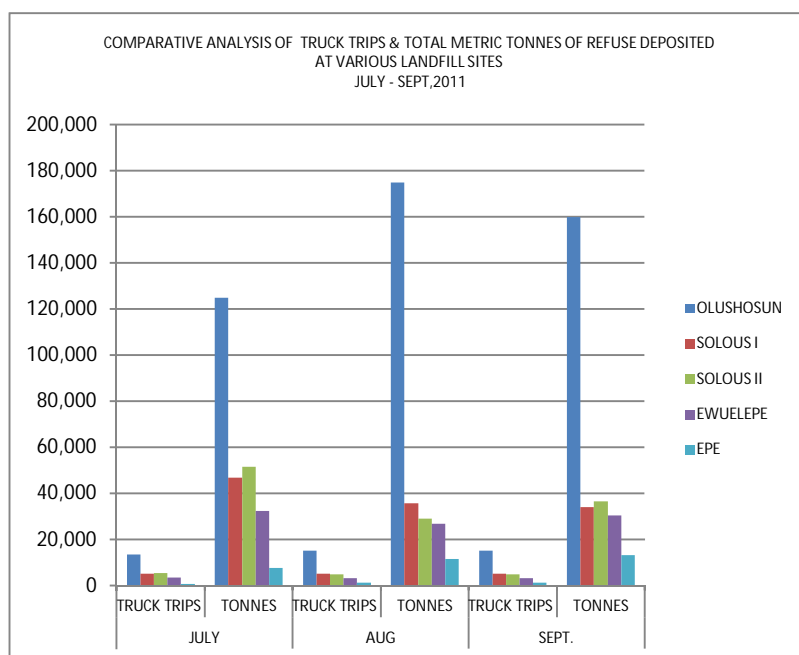


## WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2011

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services for the State during the month of September 2011. The core areas of Solid Waste Management carried out during the month under review are domestic, public waste, commercial services, medical (hazardous waste), market, marine operations, street sweeping, local policing, street monitoring, public awareness/education, enforcement, landfill management, TLS management and recycling.

2. The attached report for the month of September, 2011 indicates the following:

- A total of **274,547 metric tonnes<sup>1</sup>** of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). *(July: 263,429.58 & August: 278,770 metric tonnes)*
- A total of **30,361 vehicular trips** were received at landfill sites: **Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe and Simpson TLS.**
- A total of **7,876 safety boxes, 36,690kg** of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State. *(July: 37,741 & August: 32,889kg)*
- A total of **1,754 commercial medical/healthcare facilities** were serviced while 48 new facilities were enlisted. *(July: 1,607 & August 1,662)*
- public enlightenment and awareness programme were carried out on ten(10) radio stations and two television stations
- marine waste activities with a workforce of **745** covered the shore lines of the State with special focus on Oworonshoki, Adeniji Adele etc( see attached list)
- A total of **1,026 tonnes** of waste was collected from Lagos shoreline in the month under review
- A total of **19,392 metric tonnes** of waste was collected from markets during the month. *(July: 22,245 & August: 22,180 metric tonnes)*

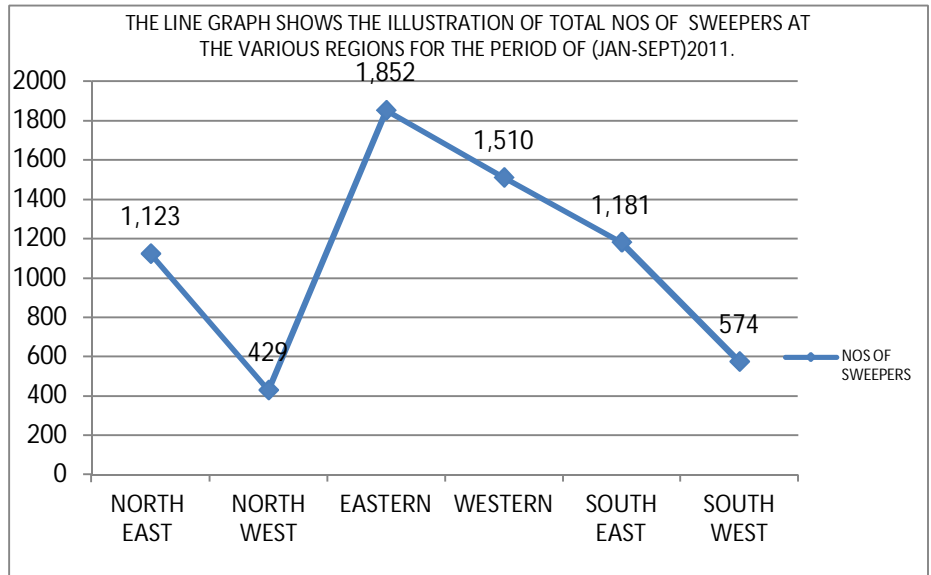

- A total of **320 PSP Operators** worked in 374 wards of 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during this period:
  - **147 complaints** relating to service delivery and issues of wrong billing were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
  - **2 PSP meetings** were held in the month
  - **9 CDA/CDC meetings** were held during the period
  - **762 Nos. of 240 litre wheeler bins** were distributed to tenements in the State during the period
  - **7,000 pieces of trash bags** were distributed to tenements during the period

- **157 Service Providers**

with 7,495 employees(Street Sweepers) and 1,500 Highway Managers were supervised during the month

- Queries were issued to 15 erring Service Providers for various misconducts e.g non payment of Street Sweepers' salaries, placement of **bagged silt on road medians & verges** as well as warnings for epileptic services
- Approval of empowerment loans was implemented for the first batch of Street Sweepers
- 4 nos. mechanical sweepers were deployed to cover night operations on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Mainland bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, Apapa, Oshodi, Airport Road

- A total number of **384** monitoring/street policing outfits carried out operations in 38 routes during the month, while major streets policed included:

- Simpson TLS received a total of **11,504.64 metric tonnes**<sup>1</sup> of waste during the month. (**July: 11,554 & August: 11,691.56 metric tonnes**)
- A total of **36,000 bags of compost** were produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost Plant while **5.147 tonnes** of plastics were recycled at Olushosun recycling plants respectively. (**July: 40,000 & August: 41,000 bags of compost**)
- A total of **20 rolls of nylon** of about **379.9kg** were produced at Olushosun Plastic Recycling Plant

3. Other notable activities of LAWMA during the month include:

- **Community Clean-up Campaign (3C)** exercise was flagged off at Makoko Community on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 2011
- **Oshodi Transfer Loading Station** was commissioned by His Excellency, the Governor of Lagos State, Mr. Babatunde Raji Fashola(SAN) on 29<sup>th</sup> September, 2011
- evacuation of **refuse backlog** at Orile and Badiya
- collection of **water hyacinth** by the marine waste collection team commenced on 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2011



4. Major observations during the month of September include:

- slight reduction in volume/tonnage of waste dumped at Olushosun dumpsite in September when compared to the month of August due largely to increase in rainfall (flooding at the tipping platform).
- poor road condition and constriction to access due to double parking within the service road was a major impediment to PSP service
- the need to centralize payment for waste collection within Military formations in the State
- the need for all Government hospitals and Public Health Care Facilities to make direct payment to LAWMA for medical waste collection services through the Ministry of Economic Planning & Budget to address the present challenges faced by Government hospitals in paying for waste management services
