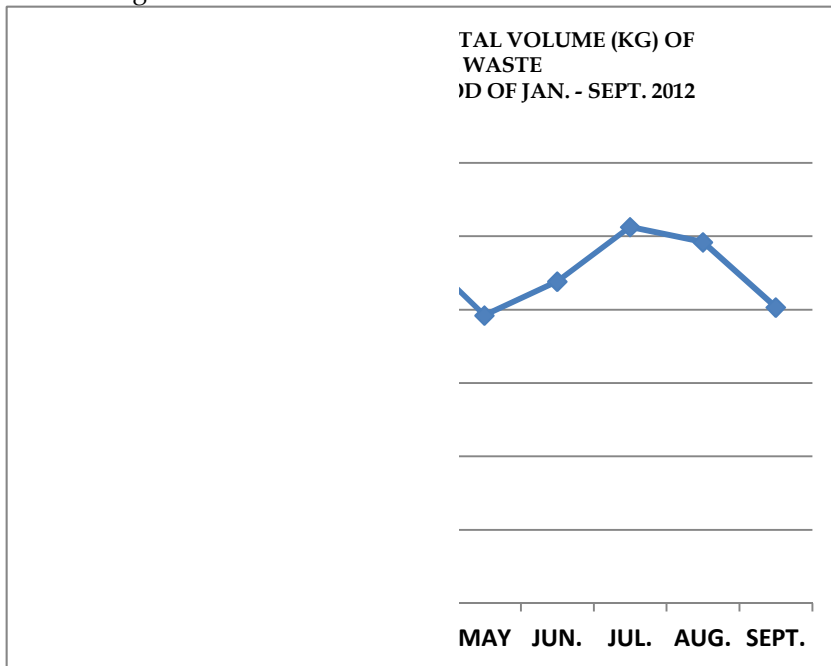
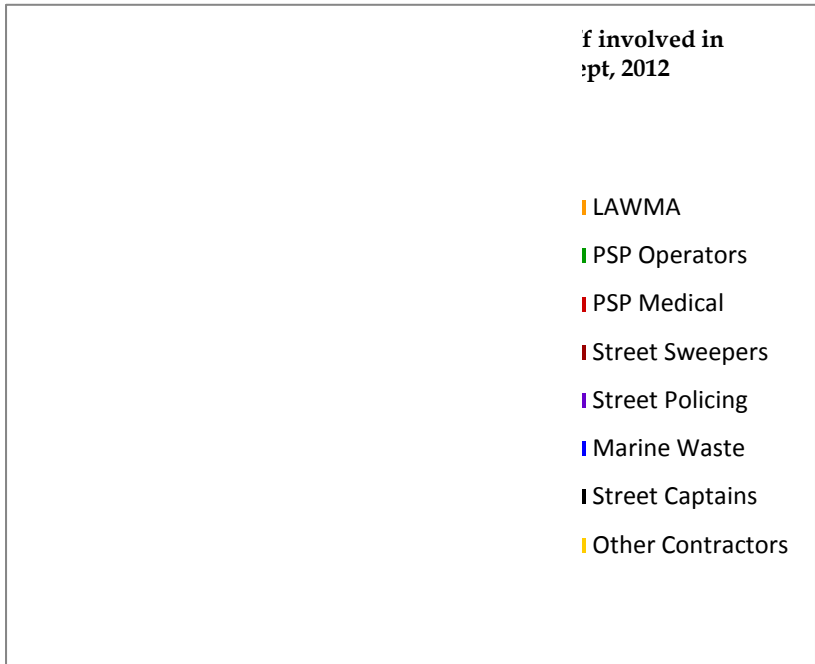


**WASTE MANAGEMENT PROGRESS REPORT FOR THE
MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2012**

The Lagos Waste Management Authority (LAWMA) co-ordinated Waste Management Services during the month of September, 2012. The core area of focus during the month under review include domestic, public, commercial, medical (hazardous), market waste, street sweeping, local policing, marine waste, public awareness/education, enforcement, recycling, landfill and TLS management.

2. The attached report for the month of September, 2012 indicates the following:

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION: Over 20,000 workforce were deployed in the service of Waste Management in the State during the month.



LANDFILL

- A total of **340,769.95m³** ⁽¹⁾ of waste was collected during the month (Landfill report attached). (*July 2012: 326,797.59m³ & Aug 2012: 335,356.44m³*)
- A total of **24,808 Vehicular trips** were received at landfill sites: *Olushosun, Solous II, Solous III, Ewu-Elepe, Epe, Simpson and Oshodi TLS*

MEDICAL WASTE

- A total of **7,359 safety boxes, 35,327kg** of pathological waste were collected from healthcare facilities across the State.
- A total of **2,393 commercial**

medical/healthcare facilities were serviced while 14 new facilities were enlisted. (*July 2012: 2,270 & August 2012: 2,363*)

PSP PROGRAMME

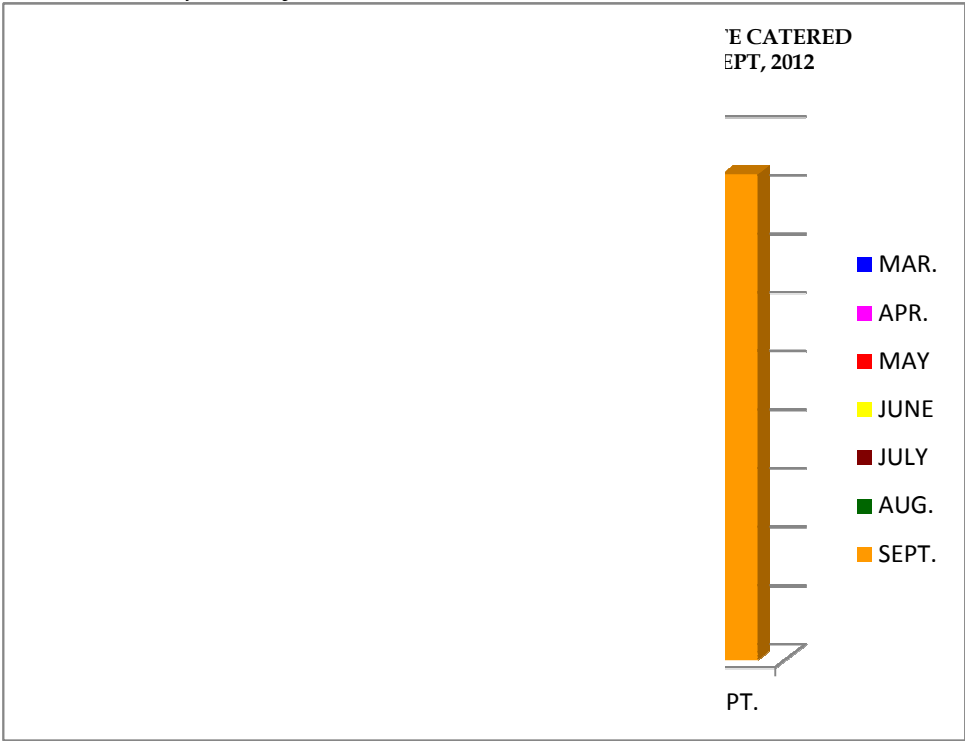
- A total of 339 *PSP Operators* serviced 372 wards in 20 Local Government Councils and 37 Local Council Development Areas of the State during the period under review
 - 270 *complaints* relating to service delivery and 56 *online bill reconciliation* were received from the public. These complaints were attended to promptly
 - 2 *PSP meetings* were held in the month (5th & 19th September, 2012)
 - 5 *CDA/CDC meetings* were held during the period in the following areas:
 - ✓ 13th September, 2012: Ikorodu-central, Ikorodu-North, Ikorodu-West, Igbogbo-Baiyeku and Ijede
 - ✓ 27th September, 2012: Badagry-West, Badagry-Central and Olurunda CDAs' /CDC
 - *Intervention services were provided by LAWMA trucks in the following areas due to poor performance of the PSP operators:*
 - ❖ *Ajgunle-Ajeromi LGA, Layeni/Owoyemi Wards-Ifelodun LCDA, Ilasamaja-Isolo LCDA, Baruwa Ward-Itire Ikate LCDA, Ebute Metta LCDA, Amuwo Odofin LGA, Somolu LGA, Odiolowo/Ojuwoye, Coker Aguda*

STREET SWEEPING

- 158 *Service Providers* with 7,670 *employees* (Street Sweepers) and 1,502 *Highway Managers* were supervised during the month with the following observations:
 - deployment of 14nos. trucks to all regions daily to ensure prompt evacuation of silts and tyres on the highway
 - evacuation of bagged silt and black bags on road medians and verges
 - deployment of 4nos. mechanical sweepers to cover night operations at Ikorodu Road, Iyana-Ipaja, Apapa, Oshodi & Airport Road & 3rd Mainland Bridge, Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, TBS, Awolowo Road Ikoyi and other major highways
 - Continuous education on health and safety for sweepers at regional levels
 - Placement of road camps in strategic routes across the region. A total of 18nos. road camp are presently located on major highways in the State

RECYCLING

- A total of 83rolls of Nylon of about 2,375kg was produced at the Olushosun Plastic Recycling plant from the collected pure water sachet from buy-back centres
- A total of 1,800 tonnes of compost were produced from market waste at Odogunyan Compost Plant while a total of 36,000bags of compost (25kg) were bagged
- Other recyclable materials collected from the buy-back centre and recycling banks includes: Cartoon 862kg, Can 130kg, Pet bottle 335kg, Nylon 19kg and Paper 93kg



MARINE WASTE

- Marine waste work force of 1,219 covered the shores lines of the state with special focus on Apapa, Ipakodo, Mile 2, Majidun, Makoko, Oworonshoki, Agboyi Creek, Epe, Ejiurin Jetty, Badagry, Ketu Alapere Canal, Lekki, Adeniji Adele along Ita Oba, Ozumba Nbadiwe, Ebute Ero, Iddo, Oyingbo Canal, Orile Canal, Walter Carrington, Agege/Oko-Oba Canal, Bode Thomas/Alaka Canal, Obalende Canal, Masha- Akerele Canal, Iwaya Canal etc
- A total of 8,286.90m³ (July 2012: 5,995.84m³ & August 2012: 6,203.74m³) of waste was collected from Lagos shorelines in the month under review

3. **NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENT**

- LAWMA had its annual Open Day Programme where its facilities at Plastic Recycling Plant, Oshodi Transfer Loading Station, Olushosun Landfill Site and Ikorodu Compost Site were visited by school children, NGO, private individuals, Nigeria School of Medical Sciences, Ojo, Health Officers from the Local Government, private companies and other stakeholders (Pictures)
- The authority continued its visit to various Local Council Development areas in its attempt to improve on the relationship between the PSP Operators and the Local Government Officials

- The construction of the Olushosun access road and other landfill Site awarded by the Ministry of Works commenced during the month
- Memorandum of understanding for the development of waste to wealth facility at the Solous Landfill Site by West African Engineering Company was executed by relevant parties
- Waste recycling centres(sorting bins) were created in 59 locations such as the Governor's and Deputy Governor's Offices, State Secretariat, Foreign Missions and Corporate outfits in the State

- The technical team of LAWMA commenced the technical aid services for the city of Freetown during the month
- Additional 320 Street Sanitation Enforcement team were recruited during the month to complement the existing Sanitation Compliance Patrol team on major streets

4. OBSERVATIONS AND CHALLENGES

- The landfill was maximally put to use inspite of heavy downpour as evident in the tonnage of waste deposited in all the Landfill sites
- The operational cost of LAWMA and PSP operators continue to grow due to increase in cost of spare parts and diesel
- The rainy season adversely affected the door-to-door collection of waste in some areas of the State due to inaccessible road network
